Below is a selection of books that appear on your General Management course reading list for Michaelmas term.

I do NOT require any pre-reading for this course. I do need to advise you, however, that your course will require an enormous amount of reading. For example, the reading list below represents a selection of less than 1/8 of what will be on your reading list for the first term alone.

If you wish to prepare yourself by doing some reading BEFORE you arrive it will make your transition into your course easier.

If you undertake this reading, please take extensive notes as you will be examined on this material at the end of your first year. Much of this reading will also apply to the essays you will write in the first few weeks of the course.

You are NOT expected to purchase these books. The list is here to help you should you have access to a good library. If you purchase books, used ones are fine. With used books, however, you need to check that the suggested chapters correspond with the edition that is listed below. If you are able to attempt even some of the books it will help you in your course. There is no preferred reading on the list. The readings are all equally useful in different ways once you begin your studies.
