Below are some key dates in the application process. You might find that not all of them apply to you, but it's a good idea to make a note of those that do. You'll receive further information from us and UCAS closer to the time.



APPLICATION TIMELINE

By End of March

Financial declaration sent out to all Offer Holders

By 1 April

Email certification to the Undergraduate Admissions Officer (for post-qualification Offer Holders)

4 June

Most students reply to offers on UCAS - confirming your firm and insurance choices

By 30 June

Financial declaration form to be completed and returned

End of June/Early July

Receive your pre-arrival reading list (most subjects)

By 31 July

English language qualifications completed and returned to the Undergraduate Admissions Office

From Mid-August

- All qualifications sat and completed
- A-level results released
- Students needing visas will be contacted by us
- Freshers' forms issued for completion and return

REMINDER: WHAT YOU NEED TO DO

Financial Declaration Forms

By the end of March, we will have been in touch with you regarding your Financial Declaration Form (FDF). The FDF asks you for details on how your studies will be funded and must be returned to us by 30 June. If you are applying for a loan via the Student Loans Company (SLC) or other funding sources, please start the application process as soon as possible as it can take a while.

There is lots of helpful information regarding fees and funding in the University's 2025 Entry Fees and Funding Guide.


Replying to your Oxford offer

Information on how to accept your offer is given on the UCAS website.

Updating to a non-school email address

If you have a school email address registered on UCAS, we ask that you change this to a personal one as your school email address will stop working after you have sat your exams and we will not be able to contact you.

Change your email address on UCAS and please also email us at undergraduate.admissions@st-hildas.ox.ac.uk from your old account to confirm this change. Please copy your new email address into the email. It is helpful if you can include your UCAS number when you contact us.







ACCOMMODATION

We're able to offer accommodation to all undergraduate students for the entirety of their course.

You don't need to apply for accommodation in your first year. A room will automatically be allocated for you in **Garden Building**, **South Building** or **Wolfson Building** on the main St Hilda's site, so all the College facilities will be on your doorstep.

Rooms have a washbasin, and generally there are two or three showers, three toilets, and a kitchen area per floor. You'll normally be on a floor with 11 to 12 other students. This gives you the opportunity to meet lots of people and make new friends.

Every College room is regularly cleaned by a College 'Scout' and you'll have access to on-site laundry facilities.

Please contact us if you need accommodation adjustments and we can discuss your requirements. (Please be aware that we will normally need to see medical evidence.)

You'll be given a key to your accommodation on the first day of Freshers' Week, so you can settle into your room and start enjoying your time at St Hilda's from the moment you arrive.



COLLEGE CATS

The College has three cats that you may spot around the site.

Our oldest cat, and a St Hilda's institution, is Teabag. Teabag's home is in the Lodge, so pop in and say hello when you're picking up your post!

JCR

When you start at St Hilda's you become a member of the Junior Common Room (JCR) and join our welcoming and active student community. Your time here is the perfect opportunity to explore your interests, whatever they may be.

SPORT

At St Hilda's, we have a number of College sports teams which everyone is welcome to join, regardless of ability level. Our sports teams include rowing, hockey, rugby, trampolining, lacrosse, football, badminton and netball.

You can even start your own Sports Society (or any Society for that matter) if you put forward a proposal to the student body; most recently a kayaking club has been started thanks to our location on the river.

CHARITY & WELFARE

The JCR committee members host various charity events, including a Charity Formal, Movember and karaoke nights. They also organise donation collections for foodbanks and the annual FemFest, a weeklong intersectional feminist festival.

Welfare events are run throughout the year, including welfare teas and pub quizzes. In addition, the 5th week of every term is welfare week!



There's lots of ways you can express your creative side at St Hilda's. There are frequent open mic nights, as well as the Drama Society and College Choir. The College also hosts weekly music recitals in our concert venue, the JdP, which is home to five music practice rooms as well as a recording studio.

St Hilda's Arts Week is an annual event that brings the whole College together through creative and artistic enterprises. it includes showcases, plays, recitals, poetry readings, acting workshops, writing groups and more!
