UNIVERSITY REGISTRATION

Please note that you must register with the University from 1 September onwards, via <u>Student Self-Service</u>, using your Single Sign-On data. Information about Single Sign-On and University registration will be sent to you by email from the University once you have returned your contract. Please check and verify your details online and update them, if necessary.

COLLEGE REGISTRATION

You are welcome to collect your University card from the Academic Office (Room 27, South Building) anytime from 12 September. Please note that your University card will not be issued unless you have completed the University registration above by using the activation code sent to you by University IT Services.

On the morning of Wednesday 8 October, there will be a College Introductions session, including a welcome from the Tutor for Graduates and introductions from key College Officers. This will be followed by a social meeting for all new graduates with current graduate students and College Advisers. Full details will be in your welcome pack.

All students at the University are required to register with an Oxford doctor. Please ensure you complete the NHS registration form, which can be found on the Freshers' webpage.

MATRICULATION

In order to be officially admitted as a member of the University of Oxford, you are required to matriculate at the start of your first degree at Oxford. The matriculation ceremony will take place on **Saturday 18 October** and attendance, in academic dress, is **compulsory** for all students.

You should wear the gown and cap of your previous University, or the Oxford University graduate gown: details about academic dress can be found on the Freshers' webpage.

Sub fusc must be worn. Sub fusc consists of a dark suit with dark socks, or a dark skirt with black stockings or trousers with dark socks and an optional dark coat; black shoes; plain white collared shirt; a black tie (a narrow black ribbon, tied in a bow, will suffice) or white bow tie. 'Dark' in this context means black or very dark grey or navy blue. Those who wear a headdress for religious reasons should choose a black scarf. Gowns may be bought at any Oxford tailor's shop. Dress should be appropriate for formal occasions.

Please note that the matriculation ceremony is only open to students.
