Many congratulations on securing your place at St Hilda's College. We look forward to welcoming you here.

ARRIVAL

The arrival date for new undergraduate students will be **Monday 7 October.** Please log into the College bookings portal (link in the top right corner of the college website at www.sthildas.ox.ac.uk) to book a move-in slot. Bookings open on 16 September. Booking has two purposes: 1) it ensures a steady flow of arrivals throughout the period to collect keys etc from the Lodge, and 2) it will allow anyone driving you to college to park on site for up to 1 hour in order to unpack your luggage from the car. You will not be allowed to park on site unless you have booked in advance. You will need to have completed your University registration (see below) to access the bookings page.

On arrival, you will be met by current second-year students who will help you carry your belongings to your room.

MATRICULATION

In order to be officially admitted as a member of the University of Oxford, you are required to matriculate. The matriculation ceremony will take place on **Saturday 19 October** and attendance, in academic dress, is **compulsory** for all students.

Sub fusc must be worn. Sub fusc consists of a dark suit with dark socks, or a dark skirt with black stockings or trousers with dark socks and an optional dark coat; black shoes; plain white collared shirt; a black tie (a narrow black ribbon, tied in a bow, will suffice) or white bow tie. 'Dark' in this context means black or very dark grey or navy blue. Those who wear a headdress for religious reasons should choose a black scarf. Gowns may be bought at any Oxford tailor's shop - see the section entitled 'Academic dress' on the Freshers' webpage. Dress should be appropriate for formal occasions.

Please note that the matriculation ceremony is only open to students.
